 - iii. On-street parking and pedestrian crosswalks were added to School Street
 - iv. The DDA contributes to the debt payment that covers these projects.
 - v. Worked on legal agreement needed for the re-alignment of Plaza Avenue.
 - Relationships:
 - i. Our staff presented at the Michigan Downtowns Conference in Holland this fall on the work being done in our community.
 - ii. Hudsonville hosted the first gathering of West Michigan DDAs on January 29.
 - Events:
 - i. Sponsored community events, including the Christmas Tree Lighting event downtown, Happenings on Harvey, and Concerts on the Green series.

 - i. Ran flower pot program facilitating flower pots at local businesses and in public spaces
